Tour Guide

NITA's tour guide traineeship is aimed at young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people who have a desire to work in the Australian tourism industry. Throughout the traineeship, students will develop a broad range of industry skills and knowledge to support their career development.

This course is designed to emphasise the preservation and celebration of Indigenous culture, ensuring that trainees are equipped to communicate and educate visitors about the rich cultural heritage of Mossman Gorge.

This qualification offers a pathway to work in guiding roles in many tourism industry sectors and for a diversity of employers including tour operators, visitor information centres, attractions, cultural heritage sites and any small tourism business.

Entrants into this NITA course are typically:

- Anangu aged 18-30 years who are interested in working in the tourism industry on Country.
- Those for whom English is not necessarily their first language.

To support the appointment of each person into the traineeship, and in accordance with NITA's Application and Enrolment Policy and Procedure, NITA's Recruitment Team assesses each applicant's suitability against the following criteria:

- Previous experience is not required,
- Basic core skills inclusive of language, literacy, numeracy and digital (LLND),r
- Have an understanding of working within the tourism sector (ascertained at pre-enrolment screening and interview and verified through the orientation program)
- A level of independence and maturity to successfully live and work away from their families and networks.

Duration

This program is delivered over 12 months as a full-time traineeship.

Delivery and Locations

Classroom based and workplace based learning. All training services are delivered at Mossman Gorge Cultural Centre.

Assessments

Range of knowledge questions, practical observations, activities, industry research, third party reports and completion of logbooks in an appropriate workplace environment.
