

SIT30125 CERTIFICATE III IN TOURISM

Tour Guide

NITA's tourism traineeship at Ayers Rock Resort is designed for young Anangu who want to build skills to work in the Australian tourism industry. Throughout the traineeship, students will develop a broad range of industry skills and knowledge to support their career development.

The course is also designed to strengthen Anangu cultural knowledge and practice, acting on community aspirations to build the next generation of Anangu tour guides. It supports trainees to develop the confidence and skills needed to communicate with and educate visitors.

This qualification offers a pathway to employment at Ayers Rock Resort within the Guest Activities and Touring teams, as well as other Anangu tourism experiences. It also provides the foundational skills needed for guiding roles across the wider tourism sector, preparing graduates for opportunities with tour operators, visitor information centres, and small tourism businesses.

Entrants into this NITA course, designed specifically for Voyages' Ayers Rock Resort, are typically:

- Anangu aged 18-30 years who are interested in working in the tourism industry on Country.
- Those for whom English is not necessarily their first language.

To support the appointment of each person into the traineeship, and in accordance with NITA's Application and Enrolment Policy and Procedure, NITA's Recruitment Team assesses each applicant's suitability against the following criteria:

- Previous experience is not required.
- Before enrolment, all participants will complete Language, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Skills assessment to identify any support needed during the program.
- Applicants should demonstrate an understanding of what is involved in working in tourism (determined during pre-enrolment screening and interview, and confirmed during orientation) and show a genuine desire to learn.
- Applicants should also show a level of independence and maturity appropriate for living and working at Ayers Rock Resort.

This qualification provides the skills and knowledge to the industry standard but does not guarantee a job post the traineeship. We encourage young Anangu to apply, including those with a disability.

Duration

This program is delivered over 2 months as a full-time traineeship.

Delivery and Locations

Face to face classroom and workplace-based learning. All training services are delivered at or around Yulara.

Range of knowledge questions, practical observations, projects, industry research, third party reports and completion of shift logbooks
